## COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT & SYSTEMS CHANGE

167 community members volunteered with UWBA

UWBA provided \$563,300 in grant funding to local nonprofit organizations

UWBA partnered with local labor councils to support working families and lead advocacy efforts to increase economic security and community benefits

UWBA distributed \$970,000 in grants to partner organizations throughout the SF Bay Area to support Housing Justice Initiative.

UWBA advocated for systems change at 3 policy-focused meetings and events

UWBA led regional advocacy campaigns that contributed to the expansion of the Golden State stimulus, CalEITC tax credits, and expanded eligibility for Child Tax Credits

## SUPPORTING BASIC NEEDS

\$87,730 in rental assistance distributed to 25 households through UWBA Rental Relief Fund

UWBA and partner agencies helped 231 households access \$384,730 in direct cash assistance to support their basic needs

UWBA and partner agencies helped provide 412,786 meals and 20,215 shelter bed nights

211 program received 10,486 calls and texts from the community, resulting in 20,559 referrals to basic needs and community resources

## FINANCIAL STABILITY & ECONOMIC EMPOWERMENT

Free Tax Help program helped 8,501 resulting in \$15,636,016 in total refunds

## IMPACT STORY FROM COMMUNITY MEMBER

### RENTAL RELIEF

A local service worker was without citizenship status, was separated from her children, and was also the victim of domestic abuse. WE RISE SF, a nonprofit grantee of United Way Bay Area, assisted her in securing safe temporary shelter for herself and one of her daughters. Next, they were able to assist her in successfully applying for immigration relief and obtaining work authorization.

Throughout this time, she and her daughter were in dire need of secure housing. She faced eviction twice, due to her situation and COVID. The team helped her get into stable housing, petitioned for her children to come to U.S., and now the family is reunited, stably housed, and starting a self-sufficient life in the U.S.

### FREE TAX HELP

Francisca is a single parent of teenage twins and a two-year-old. She has continued to work three jobs through the pandemic. The Free Tax Help program helped Francisca and her family get a total refund

of \$10,190, which includes the Federal EITC, Child Tax Credit, Credit for other dependents, as well as the Cal EITC and Young Child Tax Credit!
